





#### **Purpose Statement**

There are many recent technological advances in imaging techniques which can be applied in current clinical practice. Maintenance of certification requires continued review of essential imaging techniques in all areas of radiology, including musculoskeletal and neuro-imaging.

#### **Target Audience**

This course is designed for practical clinical radiologists.

#### **Description**

This course will review and update a wide spectrum of MR applications in neuro-imaging and musculoskeletal imaging. Presentations will include recent developments (diffusion imaging, perfusion imaging, spectroscopy); clinical topics will include stroke, brain tumors, spine imaging. On the musculoskeletal side, this course will highlight current advances in various areas such as the hip, hand, wrist, ankle and knee.

#### **Educational Objectives**

At the conclusion of the workshop, participants should be able to:

- Summarize the appropriate uses of MRI in evaluating the central nervous system and MSK systems
- Outline the current status of neuro-imaging
- Demonstrate the various MR techniques in the diagnosis of diseases of the spine and brain
- Recognize the patterns of degenerative and non-degenerative spinal diseases
- Classify the types of disorders causing hip and elbow pain
- Recognize and avoid common pitfalls that arise in standard imaging protocols



#### **Hotel and Air Travel Arrangements**
