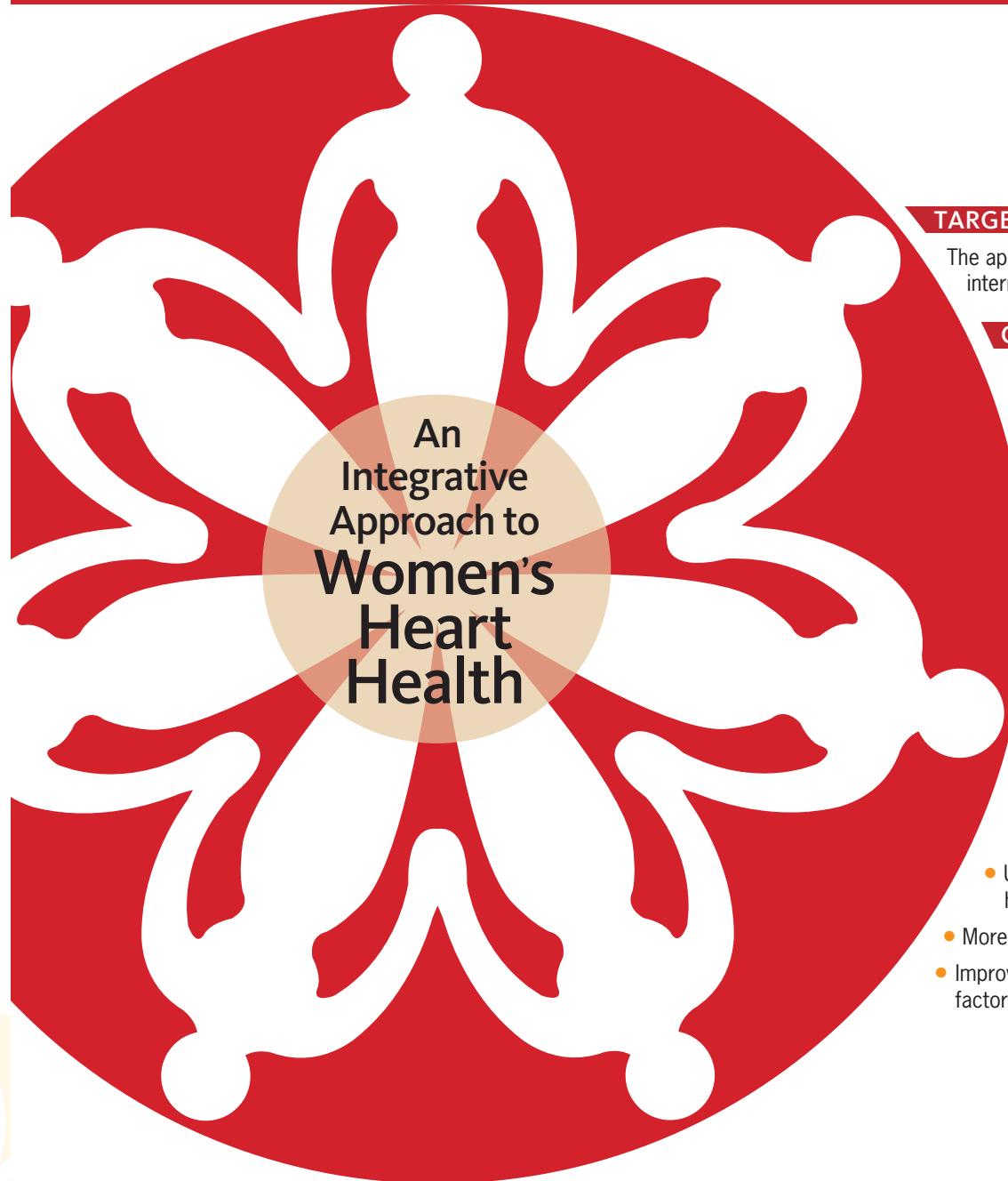

An Integrative Approach to Women's Heart Health

TARGET AUDIENCE

The appropriate audience for this course includes cardiologists, internists, nurse practitioners, nutritionists and dieticians.

COURSE DESCRIPTION/STATEMENT OF NEED

Cardiovascular disease has been the leading killer of women for more than 20 years. Although surveys by the American Heart Association have shown that women's awareness of their cardiovascular risk has increased by nearly 40% over the last 10 years, the women at risk are confused by the mass media information regarding symptoms of heart disease, hormone and aspirin therapy, dietary modification and the role of stress in heart disease. Recent studies have also been a source of confusion for physicians, regarding the use of aspirin and hormone therapy for the prevention of cardiovascular disease. This course will update physicians on the latest guidelines for the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of cardiovascular disease in women.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Identify unique signs and symptoms of heart attack and stroke in women in order to prevent secondary and tertiary complications.
- More carefully consider the risks and benefits of hormone therapy in order to prolong health and quality of life in women.
- Using evidence-based guidelines, improve the treatment of diabetes, hypertension and hyperlipidemia in women.
- More promptly diagnose and treat arrhythmias in women.
- Improve the diagnosis and management of psychosocial risk factors in women with cardiovascular disease.
